• The importance of St. Jerome in his time and place, and his connections with Dalmatia.

• St. Jerome as a saint and protector of the Croatian people, and his alleged authorship of the Glagolitic script.

• Influence of St. Jerome on Croatian literature, art, theology, and history.

Programme plan:

Day 1

- Introduction: the meaning, purpose, methodology and bibliography used for the course. (1 hour)

Day 2

- Historical situation on our sides in the Middle Ages, the relationship between the so-called Latin clergy and clergy using national language, and the background of the relations between East and West. The legend of St. Jerome as the author of the Glagolitic script. (4 hours)

- Field work (1 hour): a visit to the church of St. Jerome on the hill Marjan

 Representations of St. Jerome in the breviaries, prayers, literary, and theological works of Croatian authors. (4 hours)
- Field work (1 hour): a visit to the Franciscians of the St.
 Jerome Province at the church and monastery of St.
 Anthony, Poljud.

Day 5

- Conclusion: perspective of Jerome Studies and Heritage in Croatia and for Croats. (2 hours)
